Course aim			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> – Students will gain beginners proficiency in spoken and written Serbian language. – They will develop basic listening, reading, writing, and speaking competences in Serbian. – Course will expose students to Latin and Cyrillic orthographies. – Students will be encouraged to use the language in everyday situations. 			
Course outcome			
This course should be of benefit to any student interested in learning Serbian language. By the end of the course, the students will:			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - establish and maintain social contacts in standard everyday situations; - know minimum language competence to get acquainted with somebody; thank, reply to the greetings; express a desire; inquire and inform about the hobbies, interests; agree upon time and place of meeting; find out and give address, phone number; find out/give information about the locations; know how to use transport schedule; suggest/accept offers to have a meal at the restaurant or café; refuse offers; read the menu; order food and drinks; find out/ give information about favourite dishes, one's choice; pay for the lunch/dinner; describe everyday activities. 			
Course content			
It is an introductory-level course in Serbian for students who have no knowledge of the language. The content of beginner course in Serbian language is structured to include development of the following: mastery of the alphabet, basic vocabulary as well as the forms and syntax essential for reading and oral comprehension. In assessing the beginning student's knowledge different types of tools are used. These include quizzes (both written and oral), homework, tests, class participation/response, in-class writing exercises. Close attention is given to assessing the students' knowledge of vocabulary, forms, and syntax in context. These tools include comprehension of questions, transformation exercises, substitution exercises. Classroom drills involve the entire class as well as students individually. Different forms of tests (written and oral) are designed to check students' progress in oral comprehension, reading and speaking.
